In 1947 Tim Young rang Bruce Candy suggesting they hold a reunion and asked him for some names and phone numbers. It was decided to hold the first HMAS WESTRALIA reunion at Tim's parents' place in Alphington. Not everyone had telephones in those days, so they started with a list of just 10 guys. However, the night before the reunion Tim arrived home to the phone ringing hot. When he finally got off the phone he had to inform his mother, "There won't be 10 arriving tomorrow – there'll be 35 !"

In WWI Chris Harvey's grandfather, Edward Harvey, joined the 3rd Brigade, 12th Battalion which landed at Gallipoli on 25th April 1915. The Navy transported those troops on board lifeboats taken from P&O's DEVANHA. There are only 2 remaining lifeboats – one of which can be found at a new exhibition at the Shrine of Remembrance. (There are no photos of Chris's Grandfather as they were all destroyed in a fire.) Chris's father, Sydney Harvey, served on HMAS WESTRALIA which was commissioned to an LSI (Landing Ship Infantry) in 1943. There's an interesting connection here: Both the *Devanha* and *Westralia* were infantry landing vessels. Chris Harvey is a 3rd generation living connection to an historical event that through its tragedy shone a light on the spirit of so many.

Sunday 4 May 2014 was cold, wet and windy so the service was held inside the Shrine with a very large attendance of distinguished guests, Navy personnel, R.A.N. Band and R.A.N. Recruits. The ODE was read by Hiram Ristrom and a message from President Barack Obama was read by Miss Kim Furnish Consular Chief USA.

The Battle of the Coral Sea fought between 4 May and 9 May 1942 was the defining victory that saved Australia from a Japanese invasion and established the alliance, formed on 8 December 1941 between Prime Minister John Curtin of Australia and President Franklin D. Roosevelt of the USA.


Shrine of Remembrance

The Shrine Trustees will fly the flag of the White Ensign to honour HMAS WESTRALIA for its part in the landing operation conducted at Arawe, New Britain, 71 years ago on 15th December 1943 as a unit of the USA Seventh Fleet.

We are requested to assemble in the Shrine Forecourt at 10.45am and if the weather is against us, then in the Visitors' Centre inside the Shrine. The Service will commence at 11.00 am in the Cenotaph. Later we move to the nearby Observatory Cafe for a cuppa and catch-up.



BOOK REVIEW AND FUNDRAISER AUCTION

This 277 page book is a compilation of letters and diaries written by WWI Nursing Sister Olive Haynes who served in Gallipoli, Egypt, Lemnos and France. The letters and photos had been stored out-of-sight and out-of-mind in an old leather Red Cross satchel at the back of a linen closet. After Olive Haynes passed away in 1978, her husband handed the satchel of letters to their eldest daughter, Margaret Young who herself was a nurse. Margaret started reading the letters and realised that beyond the fascinating reading, they were a direct insight and immediate personal account into what it was really like to be in their shoes. So Margaret decided to get it into book form and had it published with all proceeds

going to Down Syndrome Association. The book was used as a source of inspiration for the ABC's miniseries **ANZAC Girls**. Extracts from book:

"15.6.15: ... Nearly seven months here and haven't had a day off yet. We are feeling as tired as 60 cats."

"30.11.15: Men from Suvia coming in. Most awful frost-bitten feet. They had a terrible time. Men frozen to death standing up. Their feet are worse than any wounds. It makes you sick doing them, and they are so grateful for anything."

"... There were 92 sisters caring for 600 patients. When the wounded from Gallipoli started to arrive, the number swelled to more than 1,400."
