IN THE PUBLIC EYE

Many who have travelled extensively and whose judgement is respected believe that the two finest major harbours in the world are Sydney and Rio de Janeiro. Those of us who were privileged to see the International Fleet Review (IFR) in Port Jackson would agree that Sydney Harbour is a magnificent amphitheatre for a maritime display of the type seen in glorious weather at the beginning of October. Colourful, spectacular and enhanced by the presence of tall ships and warships which had travelled thousands of nautical miles to participate, the busy programme of events captured the rapt attention of the residents of Sydney (and many who had travelled there from interstate), strengthened the bonds of respect and affection between the Navy and the public, and reminded Australians young and old of the significant contribution the RAN has made to making our magnificent country what it is today. Like any great event such as a Grand Final or a Melbourne Cup, 'being there' enabled one to soak up the atmosphere as well as enjoy the spectacle but TV coverage facilitated many thousands more being able to enjoy it from afar, and for all who witnessed all or part of it the 2013 IFR is likely to remain long in memory. That Prince Harry was able to be there to represent his grandmother, the Queen, added lustre (and a touch of excitement for many) to the occasion.

While for much of its first century the Navy took pride in its standing and reputation as the 'Silent Service' – an epithet inherited from its British parent service - those days are long since gone. In 21st century Australia it is essential that it maintains a high profile and that the vital importance of the work the RAN does is understood and appreciated by the public.

What a great idea that came to fruition sight and appropriately marked this on Sydney Harbour, Chief of Navy VADR Ray Griggs, AO, CSC, RAN achieved having Warships and Tall ships from across the globe visit Australia for the purpose of participating in the Fleet Review. If you were one of the million of so people to witness the Review on Sydney harbour from 3 - 11OCT13 you would have been amazed. The Review commemorated the centenary of the first entry of the Royal Australian Navy's Fleet into Sydney. In 1913 the flagship, HMAS Australia, led the Australian Fleet Unit comprising HMA Ships Melbourne, Sydney, Encounter, Warrego, Parramatta and Yarra into Sydney Harbour for the first time. They were greeted by thousands of cheering citizens lining the foreshore, as were the Warships on 4OCT this year. Both occasions could be viewed ney Harbour - exactly 100 years after as being of great national pride. Tall ships \(\) illustrated the Navy of old.



This was contrasted again a vast array of new Warships illustrating the power most impressive and capability of today's Navies. The Review, a high profile international event was Navy's signature commemorative event for 2013. 40 Warships and 16 Tall ships were an impressive

historic event. The Sea Power Centre held a Conference and there was an **International Maritime Congress and** Exposition. The fleet assembled in Jervis Bay for a practice run. The local community enjoyed the opportunity to meet and greet some of our visitors. Sydney witnessed the entry of the tall ships on Thursday 3OCT. On Friday



4OCT13 the ↑ Warships entered Sydthe first RAN Fleet entry. Her Excellency the Honourable Quentin Bryce AC CVO G/General welcomed the Fleet from Bradley's Head. The GG reviewed the fleet aboard HMAS Leeuwin on Saturday, 5OCT and then ↓ CN

and the GG took the salute as over 3,000 sailors marched past. A naval commemoration service was held at St Mary's. Some say it was the service they have ever witnessed. A great week for Navy and Australia.

HMAS GOORANGAI

The HMAS GOORANGAI Commemorative Service will be in Queenscliff at 1130 on Sunday, 17NOV13. This service remembers the loss of Navy's first surface warship. A minesweeper deployed to Bass Strait, seeking a safe mooring in Port Phillip Bay. The entire GOORANGAI crew was lost when it collided with HMAT Duntroon. . At 1110, there will be a short march from the RSL Hall in King Street to Ocean View Reserve. The service will take about an hour. The service will be supported by Australian Naval Cadets and the Geelong Memorial Brass Band. There will be a lunch in the RSL Sub-Branch hall after the service.
